

Every day, Hillel of Greater Toronto works to inspire Jewish students to make an enduring commitment to Jewish life on campus and beyond. Among the highlights from 2010-11:

- ✓ 40 students traveled and volunteered on Alternative Break experiences to Mexico, the Baltics and Israel.
- ✓ 17 CLIC (Campus Leadership Intern Community) interns built relationships with 540 unaffiliated students on campus.
- ✓ Through our Tzedek initiative, hundreds of students made sandwiches which were distributed on the streets of Toronto to the homeless.
- ✓ A student-initiated event presented the internet comedy duo Jake and Amir at a sold-out performance for 500 delighted students.
- ✓ 450 students attended *Hidden: A Purim Shabbaton* which included a Shabbaton at the Wolfond Centre and a masquerade party following.
- ✓ Hundreds of students in North Toronto sent anonymous postcards to Hillel sharing their very personal thoughts on being Jewish (visit <http://www.facebook.com/toronto.secrets>).
- ✓ 500 Israeli students continued to integrate into the community through involvement in social, educational and cultural programs including Layla Lavan, an event to celebrate Israeli culture which was attended by 400 enthusiastic students and the Spotlight on Israeli Film Schools which welcomed over 1,000 attendees during the Jewish Film Festival.
- ✓ 70 passionate students were honoured at Hillel's 15th Annual Student Awards Night.
- ✓ On behalf of Gilad Shalit, close to 1000 signatures have been gathered by students to present to the International Committee of the Red Cross to demand a guarantee of his basic human rights while in captivity.
- ✓ Together with Canada Israel Experience, Hillel has transformed the lives of hundreds of students who have visited and connected with Israel through Taglit-Birthright Israel. Our 200 Jewish students will be represented on a Russian-speaking Birthright bus again this year.
- ✓ Harvey's Table at the Wolfond Centre and Ryerson University's Bagel Lunch provided kosher, subsidized meals to thousands of appreciative students.
